 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Land and National
- 5 Park Deferred Maintenance Act" or the "LAND Act".

1 SEC. 2. LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION FUND.

2 (a) REAUTHORIZATION.—Section 200302 of title 54,
3 United States Code, is amended—

4 (1) in subsection (b), in the matter preceding
5 paragraph (1), by striking "During the period end6 ing September 30, 2018, there" and inserting
7 "There"; and

8 (2) in subsection (c)(1), by striking "through
9 September 30, 2018".

10 (b) FUNDING.—Section 200303 of title 54, United
11 States Code, is amended to read as follows:

12 **"§ 200303. Funding**

13 "(a) FUNDING FOR FISCAL YEARS 2020 THROUGH
14 2029.—From amounts covered into the fund under sec15 tion 200302 of this chapter—

"(1) \$450,000,000 in each fiscal year shall be
available for expenditure to carry out the purposes
of this Act, without further appropriation or fiscal
year limitation, to carry out the purposes of the
Fund (including accounts and programs made available from the Fund under the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2017 (Public Law 115–31)); and

23 "(2) the remainder of amounts covered into the
24 fund shall be available subject to appropriations,
25 which may be made without fiscal year limitation.

1 "(b) USES.—Amounts made available for obligation 2 or expenditure from the fund may be obligated or ex-3 pended only as provided in this chapter.". 4 (c) Allocation and Uses of Funds.—Section 5 200304 of title 54, United States Code, is amended— 6 (1) by striking "There" and inserting "(a) IN 7 GENERAL.—There'': and 8 (2) by striking the second sentence and insert-9 ing the following: 10 "(b) Allocation of Funds.—Of the total amount 11 made available to the Fund through appropriations or de-12 posited in the Fund under section 105(a)(2)(B) of the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act of 2006 (43 U.S.C. 13 14 1331 note; Public Law 109-432)— ((1)) not less than 40 percent shall be used for 15 16 Federal purposes; and 17 "(2) not less than 40 percent shall be used to 18 provide financial assistance to States. 19 "(c) PRIORITIES.—The President shall, as part of the President's annual budget submission to Congress, submit 20 21 to Congress detailed account, program, and project alloca-22 tions for funds made available under paragraph (b)(1). 23 Acts of appropriation may provide alternate allocations for 24 such amounts.

"(d) PROHIBITION ON USE OF EMINENT DOMAIN.—
 No funds made available to a State under this Act may
 be used for the acquisition of land, water, or an interest
 in land or water by eminent domain.".

5 (d) RECREATION ACCESS.—Section 200306 of title
6 54, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end
7 the following:

8 "(c) PUBLIC ACCESS.—Not less than 3 percent of 9 amounts appropriated or expended under this chapter in 10 each fiscal year shall be made available for the fiscal year 11 for projects that secure recreational public access to exist-12 ing Federal public land for hunting, fishing, and other rec-13 reational purposes.".

23	(f) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
24	for chapter 2003 of title 54, United States Code, is

 amended by striking the item relating to section 200303
 and inserting the following: "200303. Funding.".

3 SEC. 3. NATIONAL PARK SERVICE MAINTENANCE AND RE4 VITALIZATION CONSERVATION FUND.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is hereby established in the
6 Treasury a special account to be known as the "National
7 Park Service and Related Agencies Maintenance and Revi8 talization Conservation Fund".

9 (b) AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.—For each of fiscal 10 years 2020 through 2029, \$450,000,000 shall be available 11 for expenditure to carry out the purposes of this Act, with-12 out further appropriation or fiscal year limitation, to carry 13 out the purposes of the Fund. Amounts from the Fund 14 shall not be used for the acquisition of land or interests 15 in land.

(c) DEPOSITS.—At the beginning of each applicable
fiscal year, there shall be deposited in the Fund
\$450,000,000 from mineral revenues due and payable to
the United States that are not otherwise credited, covered,
or deposited under Federal law.

(d) DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR.—Of funds
made available under subsection (b) each fiscal year, the
Secretary of the Interior shall use the following amounts
for priority deferred maintenance needs that support critical infrastructure and visitor services:

1 (1) 80 percent of amounts in the Fund shall be 2 allocated for priority deferred maintenance projects, 3 including other infrastructure deficiencies directly 4 related to such deferred maintenance projects, as determined by the Secretary of the Interior and the 5 6 Director of the National Park Service, with the goal 7 of ensuring overall parity between amounts allocated 8 to transportation and non-transportation projects.

9 (2) 10 percent of amounts in the Fund shall be 10 allocated for purposes of addressing the national 11 wildlife refuge system maintenance backlog, as de-12 termined by the Secretary of the Interior and the 13 Director of the United States Fish and Wildlife 14 Service.

(3) 5 percent of amounts in the Fund shall be
allocated for the purposes of addressing the public
access and recreation backlog on public lands, as determined by the Secretary of the Interior and the
Director of the Bureau of Land Management.

(4) 5 percent of amounts in the Fund shall be
for the purposes of addressing the Bureau of Indian
Education school construction and deferred maintenance backlogs, as determined by the Secretary of
the Interior and the Director of the Bureau of Indian Education.

(e) PROHIBITED USE OF FUNDS.—No amounts in
 the Fund shall be used—

3 (1) to supplant discretionary funding made
4 available for the annually recurring facility oper5 ations, maintenance, and construction needs of the
6 entities for which amounts from the Fund are allo7 cated under subsection (d); or

8 (2) for performance awards for Federal employ-9 ees who are employed in implementing this Act.

10 (f) SUBMISSION TO CONGRESS.—The Secretary of the Interior shall submit to the Committees on Appropria-11 12 tions and Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate and to the Committees on Appropriations and Natural Re-13 sources in the House of Representatives, with the annual 14 15 budget submission of the President, a list of projects for which the amounts in the Fund are allocated under this 16 17 section, including a description of each such project.

18 (g) DONATIONS.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior, the Director of the National Park Service, the
Director of the United States Fish and Wildlife
Service, the Director of the Bureau of Land Management, and the Assistant Secretary of Indian Affairs may accept public cash or in-kind donations
that advance efforts—

1	(A) to reduce the deferred maintenance
2	backlog of the National Park Service, the na-
3	tional wildlife refuge system maintenance back-
4	log of the United States Fish and Wildlife Serv-
5	ice, the public access and recreation backlog of
6	the Bureau of Land Management, and the
7	school construction backlog of the Bureau of
8	Indian Education, respectively; and
9	(B) to encourage relevant public-private
10	partnerships.
11	(2) CREDITS TO FUND.—Any cash donations
12	accepted under paragraph (1) shall be credited to,
13	and form a part of, the Fund.
14	(3) REPORTING.—Each donation received under
15	paragraph (1) that is used for, or directly related to,
16	the reduction of the deferred maintenance backlog of
17	the National Park Service, the national wildlife ref-
18	uge system maintenance backlog of the United
19	States Fish and Wildlife Service, the public access
20	and recreation backlog of the Bureau of Land Man-
21	agement, and the school construction backlog of the
22	Bureau of Indian Education, shall be included with
23	the annual budget submission of the President to
24	Congress.
25	(h) INVESTMENT OF AMOUNTS.—

1	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Inte-
2	rior may request the Secretary of the Treasury to
3	invest any portion of the Fund that is not, as deter-
4	mined by the Secretary of the Interior, required to
5	meet the current needs of the Fund.
6	(2) REQUIREMENT.—An investment requested
7	under paragraph (1) shall be made by the Secretary
8	of the Treasury in a public debt security—
9	(A) with a maturity suitable to the needs
10	of the Fund, as determined by the Secretary of
11	the Interior; and
12	(B) bearing interest at a rate determined
13	by the Secretary of the Treasury, taking into
14	consideration current market yields on out-
15	standing marketable obligations of the United
16	States of comparable maturity.
17	(3) CREDITS TO FUND.—The income on invest-
18	ments of the Fund under this subsection shall be
19	credited to, and form a part of, the Fund.
20	SEC. 4. OFFSET.
21	It is the sense of Congress that the costs of carrying
22	out this Act should be offset.
